

# SORRENTO PRIMARY SCHOOL HEAD LICE POLICY

### **PURPOSE**

To assist parents/guardian and the school with the management of head lice.

#### **BROAD GUIDELINES**

- Head lice do not pose any serious health risks, but they can be difficult to manage.
- Most schools will have some students with head lice at any given time.
- The primary responsibility for the detection and treatment of head lice rests with parents/carers.
- Parents/carers should be supported by the school through practical advice.

#### **IMPLEMENTATION**

- Up to date information on the detection, safe treatment and control of head lice will be disseminated to parents/carers as required.
- > The school will inspect for head lice on at least a term by term basis and more frequently where possible.
- Parental/carer agreement to head lice checks will be sought in written form at the time of enrolment.
- Parents/carers to be notified in written form of those students found to have head lice and/or eggs.
- Students with shoulder length hair will tie their hair back.
- A letter will be given to all students following head lice inspections, not just those who have head lice.
- Training sessions offered on a needs basis for parents/carers to educate them about appropriate and inexpensive treatments which can be undertaken at home.
- Parents/carers are:
  - ✓ to refrain from sending their children to school with untreated head lice:
  - encouraged to inspect their child's hair for lice/eggs at least once a week – using conditioner and a head lice comb is the most effective method;
  - ✓ to notify the school if their child is affected;
  - ✓ to return the Action Taken Form if they have been notified that their child has head lice.
- In the event of live lice being found parents/carers are:
  - ✓ to treat their child prior to returning to school;
  - recommended to reassess their child every second day, over the period of a week and then reassess weekly.
- Volunteers who check for head lice will:
  - ✓ be approved by School Council;
  - ✓ be trained in identifying head lice .

✓ assist to reduce the stigma of having head lice by maintaining student confidentiality.

## **EVALUATION**

- > Reduction in the number of cases of head lice.
- Parent feedback.
